Discipline/Program: Reading

1. Apply a variety of word analysis strategies to determine the meaning of vocabulary words and increase working vocabulary.
2. Utilize literal and interpretive comprehension strategies.
3. Demonstrate appropriate reading-related study strategies to narrative and informational texts.
4. Describe and apply meta-cognitive strategies to make appropriate adaptations to accommodate narrative and informational texts.
5. Utilize a variety of information literacy strategies.

Discipline/Program: Physics

1. Model the physical world mathematically.
2. Analyze relationships between forces and motion.
3. Apply the principle of conservation of energy to systems of all scales.
4. Describe the interactions of energy and matter.
5. Use laboratory investigations to uncover and verify physical laws.
