

The University of Arizona Pima Community College Transfer Guide for 2008-2009

Bachelor of Fine Arts with a major in Art Education

This transfer guide is recommended for students attending classes at Pima Community College and preparing to transfer to The University of Arizona for the above listed majors. A maximum of 64 credits of community college course work may be applied to a bachelor's degree program at The University of Arizona. Consult your advisor regarding course selection.

ARIZONA GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM (AGEC) – 35 credits ([AGEC course lists](#) – note that second language and major requirement courses may fulfill AGECE requirements – see your Pima advisor)
Any AGECE (i.e. AGECE-A, AGECE-B or AGECE-S) will fulfill the UA general education requirements (Tier I and II). The recommended AGECE for this major is the AGECE-A.

Freshman Composition: 6 credits

Mathematics: 3 credits

Biological and Physical Sciences: 8 credits

Humanities and Fine Arts: 6-9 credits
(ART 110, 130 & 131 will fulfill this requirement)

Social and Behavioral Sciences: 6-9 credits
(POS 210 course will fulfill 3 credits of this requirement – complete a non-POS course)

Other Requirement Options: 0-6 credits
(Two language courses will fulfill this requirement)

SECOND LANGUAGE -- This requirement may be met by demonstrating proficiency in a single second language at the second semester level. MAJOR REQUIREMENTS – The following courses are available at Pima Community College for application to the listed majors:

- ART 110
- ART 115
- ART 120
- ART 130

- ART 131
- Complete three of the following courses:
 - ART 109, 128, 140 or 141, 212, 213, 215, 216
- Complete two of the following courses:
 - ART 121, 160, 180 or 181, 220
- POS 210 (or two of the following: POS 201, 214, 231)

Notes: A total of 125 credits are required for this degree, of which at least 42 must be upper-division, 30 credits taken in residence at the UA, and a minimum of 68 credits in the major. A minimum of 45 non-art credits are required for this degree. A minor is not required for this program.

SPECIAL ADMISSION INFORMATION REGARDING THE SCHOOL OF ART

Acceptance into this program is selective and competitive. In addition to meeting the general admission requirements to the UA, there are separate [admission requirements](#), including a College of Fine Arts application, a letter of intent and an essay. Consult an academic advisor at The University of Arizona for assistance in selecting the required course work.

PLEASE NOTE: STUDENTS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO COMPLETE STU 210, "TRANSFER STRATEGIES" This course offers UA campus visits, meetings with UA staff members who represent the Offices of Admissions, Financial Aid, The Center for Transfer Students and other University resources, and consultation for evaluating transfer timing. This course transfers to the UA as elective credit. See a P.C.C. counselor/advisor about enrolling in STU 210.
