3 + 1 Program: Bachelor of General Studies degree

Pima Community College and Indiana University School of Continuing Studies jointly offer the Bachelor of General Studies (120 credit hours). The first 90 credits are completed at Pima Community College and the last 30 credits are completed via distance education at Indiana University.

As a general studies student, you...

- Complete 90 credits toward the degree at Pima Community College, at PCC tuition rates
- Complete 30 credits at Indiana University, School of Continuing Studies, at Indiana in-state tuition rates – current tuition and fees are less than \$5000 for these 30 credits
- Stay in Tucson and complete your bachelor's degree via distance education
- Can apply many of PCC's degrees toward this program – see an advisor for details
- Can apply for admissions to Indiana University after 60 PCC credits—see link at the bottom of this page
- Pursue an interdisciplinary plan of study that encompasses three areas of learning:
 - arts and humanities
 - social and behavioral sciences
 - mathematics and natural sciences
- Complete required course work in these areas. In addition, you complete electives that suit your individual needs, and you may concentrate your course work in specialized fields.
- Can use a variety of options for earning the Indiana University credit toward your degree. These options include credit by examination, credit for self-acquired competency, and military service credit. And if at some time in the past you started your college education elsewhere, you may be able to transfer your credits to Indiana University.
- There is no time limit on coursework for this program.

Note: Federal financial aid not available at Pima for credits beyond those required for a Pima degree – see the Pima Catalog or an advisor for those credit requirements. Also, federal financial aid is not currently available for credits taken through Indiana University School of Continuing Studies. Alternative student loans may be available—see your Pima Community College and your Indiana University advisors.
