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THE POSITION

The Governing Board for **Pima Community College (PCC)** is seeking a dynamic, effective, and forwardthinking leader to serve as the next Chancellor. PCC will welcome its next Chancellor at a pivotal time in its history as the college seeks to continue to build on its excellent reputation, build pathways for increased student enrollment, strengthen community partnerships, and grow.

The Chancellor serves as the chief executive officer of PCC and is responsible for the executive management of the college's operations. The Chancellor provides overall leadership in the planning and management of the academic, administrative, community outreach, fiscal, operational, and auxiliary enterprise missions of PCC. The Chancellor will continue to position PCC to better serve the critical needs of the community through community engaged learning opportunities.

The Chancellor must be prepared to lead this multi-campus institution into the future and must have a strong background in financial management, teaching and/or student success, community involvement, relationship building and resource development. The Chancellor must foster a culture of trust, collegiality, innovation, and creativity across all facets of the institution and the regional community.

Campuses

Desert Vista

The Desert Vista Campus serves Tucson's southwest neighborhoods and businesses. The campus is home to the College's awarding Culinary Arts and Hospitality programs, Early Childhood Education and Post-Secondary Teacher Education programs. In addition, the College has short-term programs

designed to move students quickly into the workforce. These include Business Technology, Medical Office, Surgical Technology, Certified Nursing Assistant and Licensed Nursing Assistant. The Center for Integrated Learning is a modern space offering tutoring, library services, adult education, study areas and a computer commons. Desert Vista is home to many federally funded grants that provide vital student services and academic support. TRIO College programs and TRIO Pre-College Programs including Educational Talent Search, Upward Bound, and Veterans Upward Bound programs all help students who are already enrolled at Pima and local pre-college students in their academic pursuits. A partnership with the Desert Vista Fitness Center next to the campus is also open to students.

Downtown

Located in the heart of the city, Downtown Campus is home to a number of business and industry programs, general education courses and a full range of support services.

Automotive Technology and Innovation Center

Downtown Campus is home to the high-tech Automotive Technology and Innovation Center, part of the College's Center of Excellence for Applied Technology. The facility is the first planned in a \$35 million expansion and renovation of Downtown Campus. It houses programs in automotive technology, diesel technology and electronic vehicle technology to meet the growing demand of dealerships and other employers for students certified in today's technology.

Advanced Manufacturing and Innovation Center

Pima recently completed construction of an Advanced Manufacturing and Innovation Center. The center is a high-tech training facility working in partnership with business and industry.

Programs and Services

There also are several programs and services unique to the campus including:

- Adult Basic Education for College & Career and High School Equivalency testing
- Immigrant and Refugee Services
- Veterans Services Center
- Student Life Center, bookstore and cafe
- The College's Applied Technology programs with 3D Printing and an Industrial Technology lab
- Outdoor common areas to rest and meet friends or classmates

East

East Campus is home to the College's Information Technology and Veterinary Technology programs and serves students in general education and transfer courses. Students have the opportunity to work in the Makerspace, a high-tech educational playground, allowing students to expand their creative and technology skills. The campus is home to the nation's only community college-based live-fire cyberwarfare range, which gives Information Technology students experience seeing and managing actual threats in real time. The range is operated in partnership with the Arizona Cyberwarfare Range, and provides a free and open environment to augment cyber security resources in Arizona. Pima's Sculpture on Campus program, which began in 2004, provides an exciting opportunity for artists to present their contemporary outdoor sculptures to the public. Each sculpture is chosen to inspire the academic and creative discourse that is part of campus life. The campus is traversed by beautifully landscaped wash and bridges and is surrounded by contemporary sculptures that invite a stroll through the gardens.



Northwest

Northwest Campus features the Colleges' most modern science labs as well as high levels of technology in classrooms and laboratories. It is home to a number of STEM programs and pathways. Host to annual STEM events, the Northwest Campus seeks to connect campus and community through science and technology adventures. The campus is home to short-term healthcare programs in clinical research, therapeutic massage and pharmacy. At the heart of the campus are integrated student support services, including student work areas, advising, tutoring, library resources, clubs, recreational space and a tech center. A partnership with the YMCA, on the north end of the Campus, allows students to take classes and take advantage of fitness and wellness activities.

West

Home to the Center of Excellence for Health Professions, West Campus provides state-of-the-art education opportunities in Nursing, Radiologic Technology, and Respiratory Care. Dental Studies students have the opportunity to practice a patient-centered approach with hands on experience in the state-of-the art dental clinic as they work with community members and fellow students. Students can prepare for careers as dental hygienists, dental assistants and dental laboratory technologists. The Digital Arts Program prepares students for careers in web design, film and video, graphic design,



gaming and simulation, illustration and digital photography. Students receive hands-on instruction using the latest technology. The Fashion Design program prepares students for entry-level work for apparel manufacturers, clothing retailers and more, or for starting a business. Studies include fashion drawing, imaginative design and drafting. Students can pursue an Associate of Applied Arts with a Fashion Design concentration. The Center for the Arts complex consists of the 425-seat Proscenium Theatre, the 75-plus-seat Black Box Theatre, the 75-plus-seat Recital Hall and the Louis Carlos Bernal

Gallery. Across the academic disciplines of music, art, theater, and photography, West Campus offers a wide range of programs in which students can study and learn as well as multiple venues for the community to experience student performances and exhibits.

Learning Centers



Adult Learning Centers

Located at the Downtown Campus, the <u>Adult Basic Education for College & Career</u> (ABECC) programs provide basic adult education services and high school equivalency preparation and testing for our community.

Classes are offered at PCC's three Adult Learning centers, providing community members with

- Free reading, writing, math and English classes that prepare adult learners for success in college and career
- High School Equivalency preparation and testing
- Integrated Education and Training opportunities
- Rights and Responsibilities of Citizenship classes



Davis-Monthan Air Force Base Learning Center

Pima Community College offers a range of classes on the Davis-Monthan Air Force Base leading to degree and transfer programs. The center serves both active-duty military personnel and the public. <u>Classes on Davis-Monthan Air Force Base</u> are offered primarily in 8-week sessions. Daytime and

evening classes are taught in traditional or web/classroom hybrid formats to provide flexibility and convenience. Students receive the same services that are available on Pima's campuses, including assessment exams, financial aid services, and admissions and registration advising. CLEP and DSST testing is offered at this site for active duty and DoD contractors at no charge. Non-military affiliated PCC students may also take the CLEP exam at the DMAFB test center for a fee and if they have base access. The College partners with the Community College of the Air Force through the <u>General</u> <u>Education Mobile (GEM)</u> program to offer general education courses that meet CCAF degree requirements.



Pima Community College at Santa Cruz Center

Pima Community College offers classes in Nogales, Arizona, located along the Mexican border in partnership with the Santa Cruz Center. Students can take courses toward transfer or can complete a number of transfer and workforce programs. In just one or two semesters, students can earn a certificate with Pima Community College at Santa Cruz Center. These certificates also can lead to a full Associate of Applied Science degree. They include:

- IT Technician (Cybersecurity/Networking)
- IT Specialist (Cybersecurity/Networking)
- Business Administration
- Logistics and Supply Chain Management
- Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Get a Pima Associate and UA Bachelor's Degrees in Nogales

A Pima Community College University of Arizona Nogales partnership offers more than a dozen programs allowing students to get associate and bachelor's degrees at Pima Community College at Santa Cruz Center.

The Partnership includes 15 2+2 programs, including Psychology, Administration of Justice, and Elementary Education.

Transfer Degrees

PCC at the Santa Cruz Center offers associate degrees, certificate programs, university transfer courses ("the basics") and developmental classes. Many of the degrees enable students to complete their lower-level course requirements before transferring to a four-year college or university.

Lifelong Learner Discount

Individuals who are 55 years old on or before the first day of the semester for which they are enrolling are eligible for a 50% reduction in the general in-state tuition for credit courses.

Centers of Excellence



Pima Community College is committed to advancing economic development in Southern Arizona. In close partnership with business, government and community leaders and stakeholders, PCC developed Centers of Excellence to provide high-tech training and reskilling of both new and incumbent workers and contribute to the overall economic vitality of Pima County and the surrounding region.

The characteristics of Pima Community College's Centers of Excellence are:

- RESPONSIVENESS: Create and deliver in-demand programs and employees, stackable credentials, degrees and certificate programs.
- CONVERGENCE: A community hub for open resources, apprenticeships, seminars, and forums on thought leadership.
- ADAPTABILITY: A high level of professional development, career guidance and real-world experience aligned with the region's demand.

The Centers will drive opportunities for students and help fuel our region's economic growth.

Center of Excellence in Applied Technology

Based at Pima's expanding Downtown Campus, the Center of Excellence in Applied Technology features the Automotive Technology and Innovation Center, which opened in 2021, and the Advanced Manufacturing Building, which opened in 2023. The Advanced Manufacturing Building will house Automated Industrial Technology (AIT), Computer-Aided Design (CAD), Machining (MAC), and Welding (WLD) programs. The ST building next door will be renovated, allowing the Building & Construction Technology (BCT) programs to expand from 2,000 sq. ft. to 20,000 sq. ft.

Aviation Technology Center



While located at Tucson International Airport in dedicated hangar space, the <u>Aviation Technology Center</u> is part of the Center of Excellence in Applied Technology. PCC is the only Aviation repair and maintenance training program in Arizona that provides hands on training on both commercial and regional jets. The program has a national reputation for excellence, and its graduates are in high demand by employers. This expansion will double the number of new graduates every year, filling openings

that would otherwise potentially go unfilled, earning an average of \$52,000 per year, and generating payroll revenue to the statewide economy.

Center of Excellence in Health Professionals

The Center of Excellence in Health Professions is based at Pima's West Campus and provides state-ofthe-art training in multiple healthcare programs including Nursing, Surgical Technology, Respiratory Care, Medical Laboratory Technology, Dental Studies and more. The Center of Excellence clusters these integrative programs into a single unit that supports the multiple career pathways our students will access. Funding has been identified to develop high-tech space that mimics a hospital environment.

Already students benefit from technology including iPads that expand learning and understanding through augmented reality and enhanced video. Simulation mannequins allow students to learn and hone skills in a safe and supportive environment before moving into clinical care for actual patients.

The programs are preparing for a future that:

• Prepares future healthcare professionals to function in a world where technology and medical devices are actively monitoring/measuring chronic illness, including implanted devices.

- Increases understanding of how technology impacts daily living activities including fitness, health education, tracking of symptoms, and disease management.
- Prepares future health professionals to provide liaison and coaching support to patients in the work of mobile, wireless, telemedicine, and smartphone applications.
- Prepares future healthcare professionals to function in a world of telehealth and telemedicine.



Center of Excellence in Information Technology/Cybersecurity



Located at the East Campus, this rapidly growing program is centered around the <u>Arizona Cyber Warfare Range</u>, the only "live-fire" cyber range at a community college. The Range is a unique opportunity and partnership. Operated by students and community volunteers, it provides a safe zone where IT professionals, community members and students alike can safely explore "live fire" cyber attacks and defenses. Students, community members and

businesses have the opportunity to test, monitor, and harden the security of all types of technology and IoT devices within the Arizona Cyber Warfare Range and the CoE. This creates a diverse learning environment, not restricted to virtual simulations, that complements the traditional educational models. We regularly have instructional and participatory events with K-12, Association for Career Technical Education of Arizona, general public and business. In addition, Pima's goal is to fundamentally change IT education and provide practical hands on experiences, interacting with the community and workforce. The Center creates this nexus through four primary areas:

- **Student Run Datacenter**: The datacenter provides students with an enterprise IT environment incorporating multiple systems, vendors, technologies. Like most data centers today this datacenter expands beyond our physical location into Google Cloud services to give students realistic IT experiences.
- **Cybersecurity Operations Center**: The student CSOC provides a facility where students can analyze and monitor threat feeds, and provide response information in real time. Additionally, the AZCWR which is also an Information Sharing and Analysis Organization (ISAO), is providing international threat intelligence to Pima from its sources and partners worldwide. This combination makes the Pima CSOC a credible and active threat response resource.
- **Fusion Space**: This is an active learning room that accommodates a variety of events ranging from short seminar topics, to class and student activities that range from Capture The Flag competitions, cross disciplinary teaching, to vendor and community collaboration.
- The Arizona Cyber Warfare Range

Center for Excellence in Public Safety and Security



This Center features Fire Science and Emergency Medical Services, the Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice and Transportation and Logistics. Nationally recognized is Pima's partnership with the U.S. Airforce to provide Medical Readiness Agency (AFMRA) to train airmen as nationally credentialed Paramedics in an expedited program. PCC trains the majority of Pima County's first responders with partnerships that include: 2 law enforcement agencies, 12 Fire Departments/Districts, 6 hospitals and 1 ambulance company. PCC is also developing and offering the entire Logistics and Supply

Chain Management certificate and degree online.

Center of Excellence in Hospitality Leadership

Designed to support Tucson's important hospitality and tourism industry, Pima's Center of Excellence works with industry partners to prepare students for today's challenges and opportunities. Combining classroom work with hands-on experiences, Pima's students are prepared to handle a wide-range of responsibilities and are indemand by area employers. The program is using its first Title V grant "Pathways to Hospitality," a \$2.7 million award, to create state-ofthe-art facilities featuring three commercial kitchens, a recommissioned grill, a new restaurant and bistro, open to the public, and hotel suite learning labs. A highlight of the center will be a



Demonstration Kitchen and Amphitheater equipped with advanced teaching technology using mobile, cloud, and IOT for virtual, online and augmented learning. The space will provide the ability to hold business and community projects and events.

Center of Excellence in Arts and Humanities

Pima Community College's Arts and Humanities prepares communicators and creative and critical thinkers for challenging positions in a wide range of fields. Featuring beautiful performance space and art gallery space, Pima's arts students receive classroom and real life experiences. Arts organizations stimulate business and economic growth. The creative industries throughout the United States employ nearly 3 million people and make up around 4 percent of the nation's businesses. Each year, non-profit arts and culture organizations alone pump an estimated \$60 billion into the national economy.

Moreover, research has shown that cities that emphasize art have more civic and social engagement, better child welfare and even lower poverty rates.

Student Life



PCC Student Life provides many opportunities for students to get involved in activities that interest them. Participating in activities outside of the classroom enhances one's college education, allowing students to form friendships while building teamwork and leadership skills. These activities also become part of a student's résumé and can be listed on college transfer applications. Pima's campuses offer many <u>student clubs</u> with a wide variety of focuses including culture, wellness, personal interests, careers, religion and more.Students can build or enhance leadership skills through participation in the <u>Pima Leadership Institute</u> (PLI). Participation in PLI provides students with diverse perspectives,

service learning experiences, and an opportunity to develop integrity and excellence in their pursuits as leaders. PLI encompasses a variety of leadership programs and options to provide students with a personal leadership experience while at PCC.

THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

Tucson, Arizona, is a vibrant city of breathtaking beauty located in the southern part of the state, in the Sonoran Desert. Tucson's climate is characterized by hot summers and mild winters. It receives abundant sunshine 300 days per year. Metropolitan Tucson has a population of around 550,000 people, making it the second most populous city in Arizona after Phoenix. The greater Tucson area is home to nearly 1 million people.

Tucson is known for its rich cultural heritage, including its vibrant arts scene, historic sites, and diverse cuisine. The city also boasts numerous attractions such as the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum, Saguaro National Park, Tucson Botanical Gardens, and the Pima Air & Space Museum.

With its stunning desert landscapes and mountainous terrain, Tucson offers ample opportunities for outdoor activities such as hiking, rock climbing, biking, and birdwatching. The nearby mountains, including the Santa Catalina Mountains and the Tucson Mountains, provide great recreational opportunities.
