Pima Community College (“College”) will evaluate the educational needs of its constituencies, develop appropriate instructional courses and programs to meet those needs, and eliminate courses and programs which are no longer meeting a significant need.

As a comprehensive community college, the College will offer a variety of credit and non-credit courses and programs to meet the needs of students and the community aligning with the College’s mission and vision. Specific course requirements necessary to obtain a degree, certificate, or other award shall be specified in a College catalog.

The College’s requirements for degrees, certificates, and other awards shall be consistent with the standards established by the applicable accrediting bodies, as

well as with the regulatory requirements of responsible federal and state agencies.

The Governing Board shall approve all additions, deletions, and substantive changes to programs as defined by the College's accreditor and the Federal Department of Education. The Governing Board delegates to the Provost/Executive Vice Chancellor the authority and responsibility to review and approve all other program adjustments, as well as, new, modified, and deleted courses, taking into consideration input and recommendations received from College stakeholders.
