

Current Graduation/Completion and Transfer Rates — Student Right to Know Reporting for July 2014

Pima County Community College District provides the following information regarding its graduation/completion and transfer rates in compliance with the federal Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008. The rates reflect the graduation and transfer status of students newly enrolled during the 2010-2011 academic year and for whom 150 percent of the normal time-to-program completion has elapsed.

During the fall semester 2010, 2,204 first-time, full-time, certificate- or degree-seeking undergraduate students entered Pima County Community College District (PCC). After 150 percent completion time had lapsed, 6.8 percent of these students had graduated from PCC and 20.0 percent had transferred to another institution of public higher education in Arizona. This gives PCC a success rate of 22.9 percent.

Student-athletes Receiving Athletic-Based Financial Aid

During the 2010-2011 year, 82 first-time, full-time, certificate- or degree-seeking undergraduate student-athletes received athletic-based scholarships while enrolled at PCC. After 150 percent completion time, 15.9 percent of them completed their programs.

Graduation and Transfer Rate by Sport, Ethnicity and Gender
