Placement

Students must meet prerequisite standards before taking MAT 142 and WRT 101 in the pathway below. If you are not prepared for these courses based on placement results you will need to take courses to build your skills prior to taking them. The sequence of courses follows.

Math: ICS 081 > MAT 092 > MAT 142

Reading: ACL 080 > REA 091

Writing: ACL 080 > WRT 090 > WRT 101 (or WRT101S can replace both WRT 090 and WRT 101)

If MAT 151 or higher is chosen, additional coursework may be needed.

Semester Pathway

This pathway is a suggested sequence of courses for your program of study. Work with an advisor to develop a unique pathway for you based on your placement recommendations, any prior college courses and your specific situation.

General Education Note: When General Education (Gen. Ed.) credits are listed below, select from the appropriate General Education course list linked from the program website. Some programs recommend specific courses.

For this pathway, ensure that the I, C and G requirement is met.

Second Language: 101-level language course. Select a language that also has 201-202 level courses. (4 credits)

Semester 2- Spring (Semester Total: 16 credits)

ECE 108: Literature/Social Studies for Children (3 credits)
or **EDU 200:** Introduction to Education (3 credits)

MAT 146: Mathematics for Elementary Teachers I (3 credits)

WRT 102: English Composition II (3 credits)

Gen. Ed.: AGEC Social & Behavioral Science List. Recommend ANT 112: Exploring Non-Western Cultures or HUM 260: Intercultural Perspectives (3 credits)

Second Language: 102-level language course. Select the same language as the 101-level course. (4 credits)

Semester 3 - Fall (Semester Total: 14 credits)

EDU 206: Relationships in Classroom Settings (3 credits)

MAT 147: Mathematics for Elementary Teachers II (3 credits)

Gen. Ed.: AGEC Biological & Physical Science list – BIO course only. Recommend: BIO 105IN: Environmental Biology (4 credits)

Second Language: 201-level language course. Select the same language as the 101-102 level courses (4 credits)

Semester 4 - Spring (Semester Total: 16 credits)

POS 210: National and State Constitutions (3 credits)

STU 210UA: University of Arizona Transition (2 credits)
or **STU 210UT:** University Transition (2 credits)

Gen. Ed.: AGEC Biological & Physical Science list – non-BIO course only. Recommend: AST 101IN, CHM 130IN, GEO 101IN, GEO 102IN, GLG 101IN, or PHY 121IN (4 credits)

Gen. Ed.: AGEC Fine Arts list: Recommend: ART 105: Exploring Art and Visual Culture (3 credits)

Second Language: 202-level language course. Select the same language as the 101-201 level courses (4 credits)
