At approximately 8:55 a.m. while on vehicle patrol of the east side parking lot of the Downtown Campus, a PCC police officer heard screaming coming from the area of the campus marquee located near Speedway Ave and Stone Ave. Upon looking towards that direction, he witnessed a female being knocked to the ground by a male, after which the male began to run northbound on Stone Ave in front of the campus. The officer, with the assistance of a male student who also witnessed the attack, apprehended the suspect. The victim, a PCC student, told the officer that the suspect approached her from an unknown direction, grabbed her cell phone and knocked her to the ground. Medical personnel treated the student on scene for minor injuries and released her. The suspect admitted to taking methadone and morphine and being under the influence. He was treated at the scene for minor injuries sustained, as well as a possible drug overdose. Suspect was subsequently booked into jail after being cleared by medical personnel. The suspect resides approximately 2 miles north of campus.
