Tips for awareness and prevention

- If you're in a restroom, locker room, or changing area and notice someone lingering, using a phone oddly, or trying to position themselves near stalls or mirrors, leave the area immediately and report it.
- Trust your instincts. If you sense something isn't right, get away from the area as soon as possible.
- Remain alert and observe people around you. Walk with your head up, avoid carrying too many items, show confidence while walking, and know your destination.
- If possible, have your phone ready and know where you are at all times. Call PCCPD at (520) 206-2700 for an escort from a police officer or community service officer.
- Report individuals of concern on campus to Pima College Police at (520) 206-2700 or dial 911, so that we can determine the safety of that person for the community and the individual themselves.
- Make mental notes of a suspect's race, age, sex, height, weight, hair, eye color, physical build, and clothing. Note anything unusual about the suspect, such as scars, tattoos, unique clothing, strange mannerisms, or speech patterns that you can share with police.
