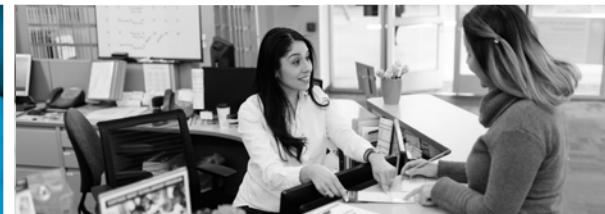
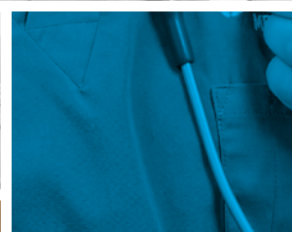

The College is closed May 31, June 18, July 5, Aug. 13, Sept. 6, Nov. 11 and Nov. 25-28, but, during those times, you may register and take other actions through your MyPima student account.

Details for summer and fall 2021:

- Summer semester Session A and B (5-week), C (8-week and 10-week) and D (8-week) classes run June 1-Aug. 10, with various beginning and ending dates
- Fall semester classes run Aug. 19-Dec. 14, with various beginning and ending dates.

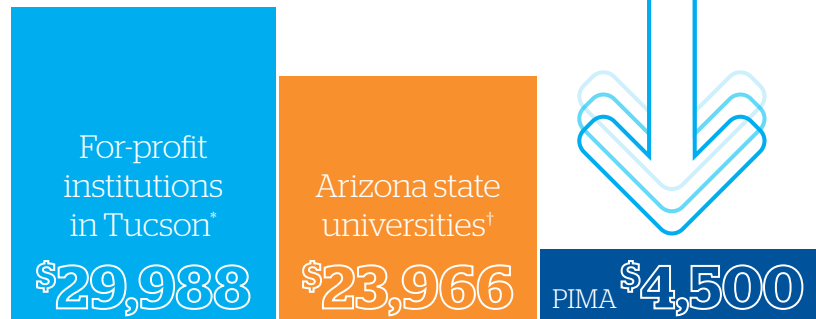

Did You KNOW?*

- ▶ 55% of new Pima full-time degree-/certificate-seeking students received some sort of financial aid in 2019-20.
- ▶ 58% of all transfer students enrolling at the University of Arizona in fall 2020 came from Pima.
- ▶ Among students enrolled at Pima between January 2015 and April 2020:
 - 25,000+ have attended or have graduated from one of Arizona's state universities; 22,365 through UA.
 - 432 have attended some of the country's most prestigious colleges and universities, including Harvard (23), Columbia, Duke and Yale (10 each), Johns Hopkins (14) and Cornell (13).
 - 27,037 have graduated from one of the country's 200 best colleges and universities, including UCLA, USC, Iowa, Stanford and Texas A&M.

WiFi access, technical resources and D2L help – While Pima has restricted access to campus buildings, WiFi access is available outside.

WiFi access: Pima students can access WiFi in the parking lots of the Desert Vista, Downtown, East, Northwest and West campuses from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Students also can access Sunnyside Unified School District "hot spot" locations. Bring your Pima student ID to all locations.

QLESS Advisor Call Back – If you need to talk to an advisor, the quickest way to reach one is through the QLESS online sign-in system. All you have to do is:

1. Sign in here: <https://kiosk.na1.qless.com/kiosk/app/home/100100000137>

2. Enter your name and cell phone number in the boxes provided.
3. If you know your student ID number and program of study, enter each of them.
4. Pick the area and service that best fits your needs or select "Other."

Once in line you will receive text messages to the cell phone number you provided, with an estimated time for the call back. Once you have reached the front of the line, an Advisor will call you on the phone number provided. You can call from a landline phone too, but you will not receive the text messages.

- Saturday, 9 - 11 a.m.

Aztec Athletics

The Pima Aztecs have 15 teams that compete in the NJCAA. They may adjust their schedules, and game and practice protocols due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Their official website includes each team's contact info, schedules and a "Prospective Athletic Forms."

Annually, Aztecs teams excel academically. A record six Pima teams earned 2019-20 NJCAA Academic Teams of the Year honors: Women's Basketball (3.36 GPA); Women's Soccer (3.31 GPA); Men's Cross Country (3.23 GPA); Men's Basketball (3.09 GPA); Volleyball (3.07 GPA); and Baseball (3.05 GPA). And, 33 Aztecs players, including 13 with perfect 4.00 GPAs, earned NJCAA All-Academic honors.

Review Student Aid Report

- ▶ Your FAFSA results will be mailed or emailed to you as a Student Aid Report (SAR). Carefully read the SAR. If you find errors, make corrections online at fafsa.gov.

Finalize Documents

- ▶ The U.S. Department of Education will send an electronic version of your FAFSA to Pima. After Pima receives the electronic record, staff will determine if any other information is needed to complete your file. Pima will post these requirements to your MyPima Financial Aid tab. The needed items will be indicated with a red "X".
- ▶ Processing of your application may take two to three weeks from the date the College receives your FAFSA and any other requested documentation.

- ▶ Regularly check your MyPima Financial Aid tab, your Financial Aid Messages and your Pima student email account for updates on your financial aid status.

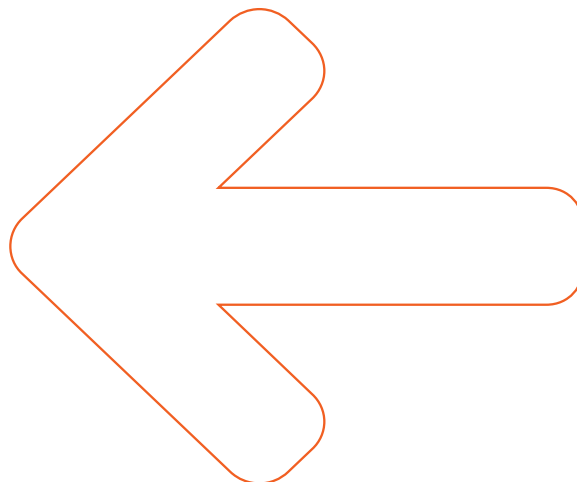
