Gain firefighting, hazardous materials and wildland firefighting skills. This program meets Arizona certification requirements for Firefighter I and II, and will enable students to achieve International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC) certification as a Hazmat First Responder. In addition, students will be awarded a certificate of completion for wildland firefighting training from the National Wildfire Coordinating Group. Complete this program by taking classes in a combination of evenings and weekends.

Semester 2 - Fire Academy (Semester Total: 19.75 credits)

FSC 110: Ropes I (.75 credit)

FSC 127: Principles of Emergency Services Safety and Survival (FESHE Core) (3 credits)

FSC 130: Strength and Fitness for Fire Science (1 credit)

FSC 149: Fire Operations I (4 credits)

FSC 150: Fire Operations II (4 credits)

FSC 153: Hazardous Materials (1.5 credits)

FSC 160: Wildland Firefighting (2 credits)

FSC 173: Records and Reports (.5 credit)

** EMT 100 will be waived when student provides a State or National EMT certification acquired through education received from a non-college institution. Student will complete PCC Fire Academy Certificate with 19.50 credits awarded.*
